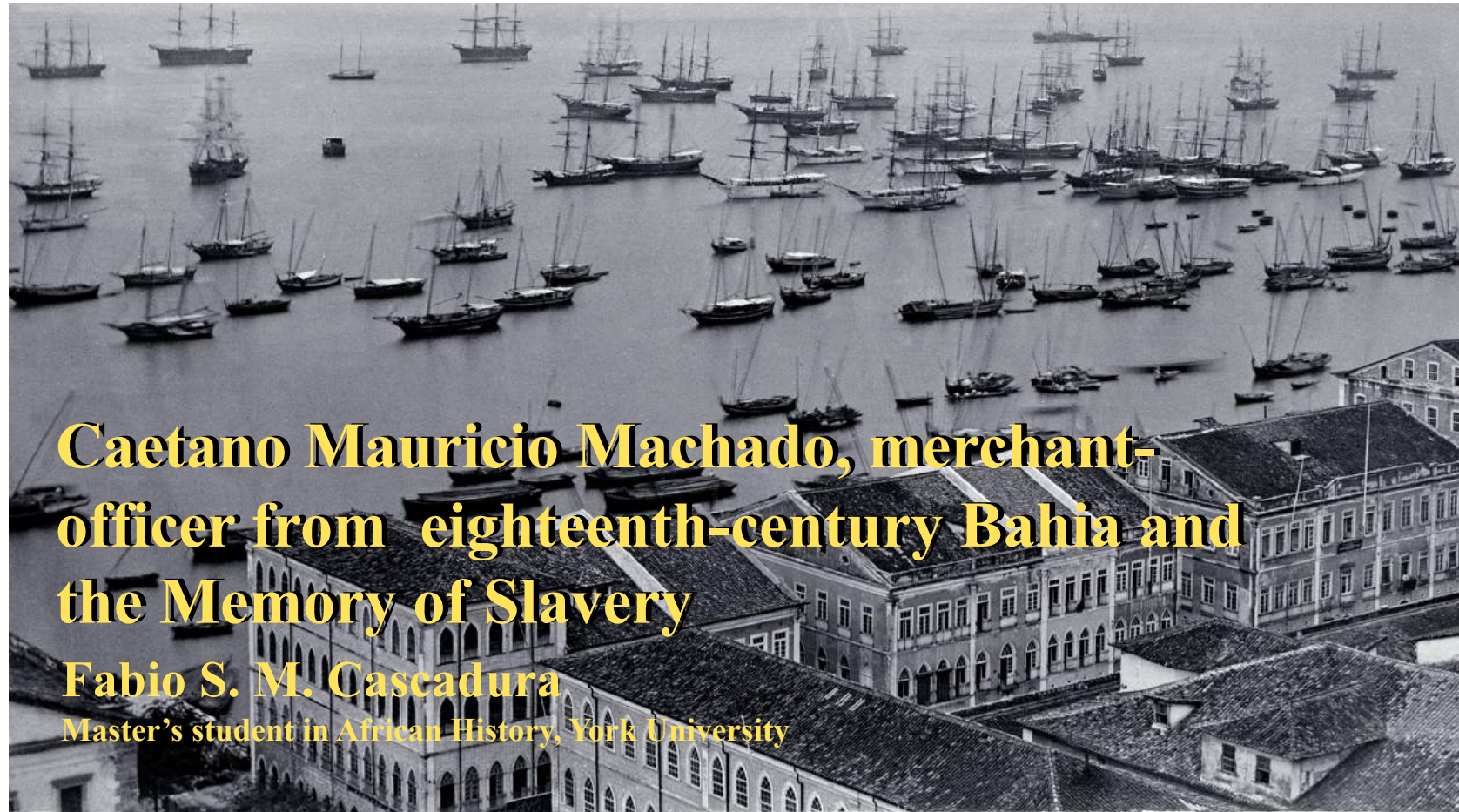

Portuguese Colonial Army Forces in Bahia (1798)

Caetano Mauricio Machado occupied an officer position in the 1st Regiment of Infantry.

That was created in 1776 and named as Regiment of Chosen and Useful People to the State (Regimento d Gente Escolhida e Útil ao Estado) being directly subordinated to the province governor.

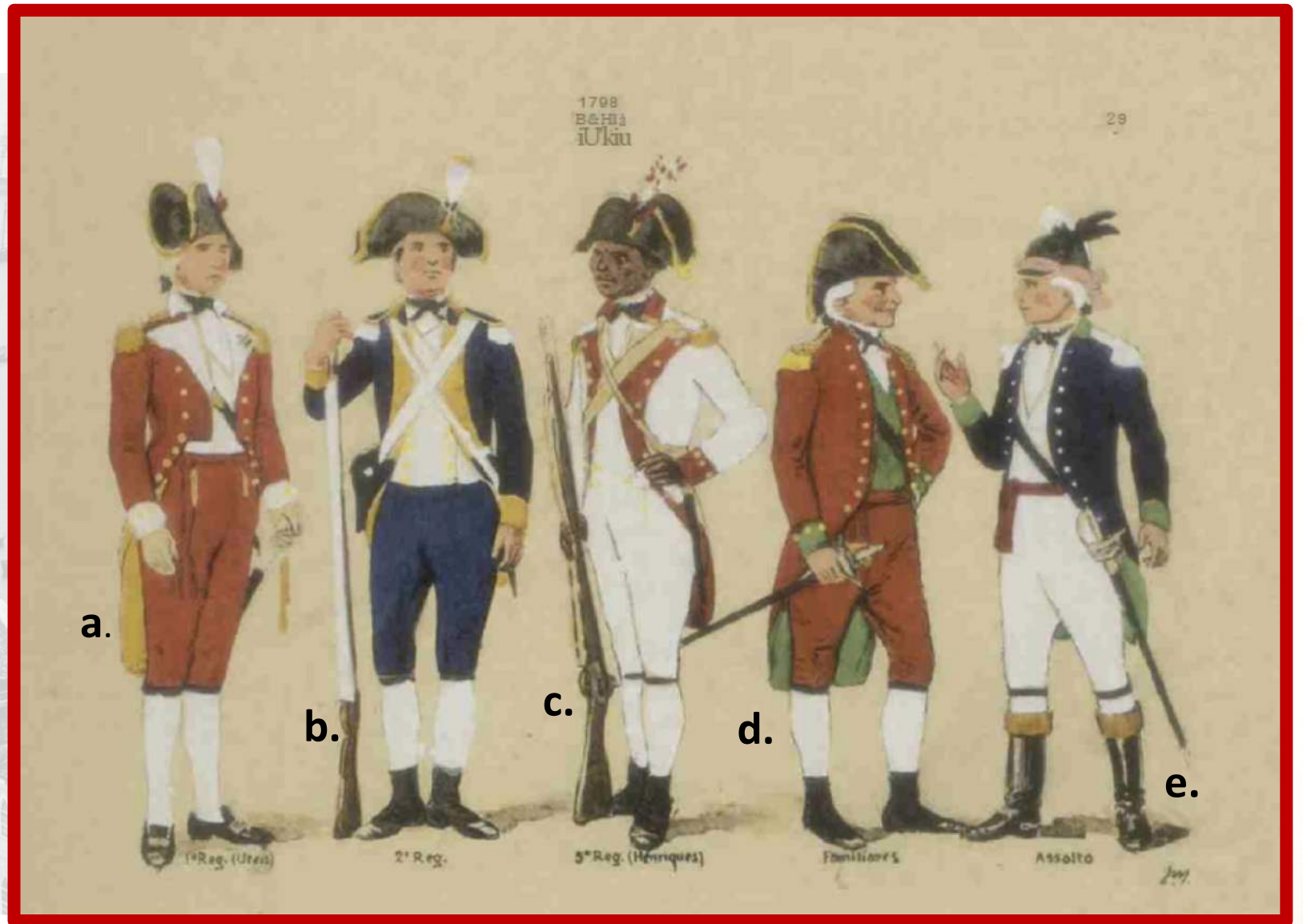

**War in Bahia for Independence of Brazil
February, 1822 - July 2, 1823**

Fifteen years after Machado's death, his sons, also military-officers, were involved in the events related to the War for the Independence of Brazil in Bahia.

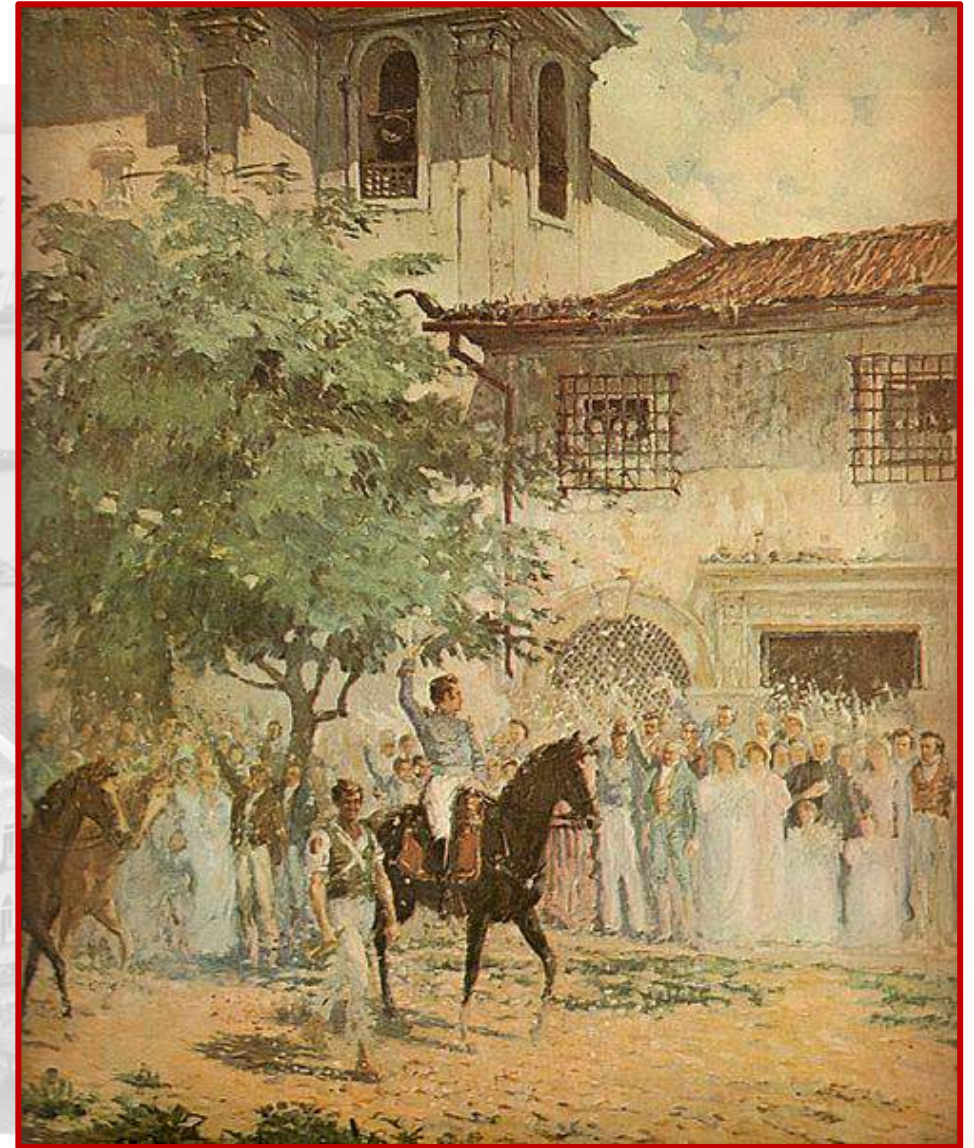


Image 4. "Entrada do Exército Libertador" by Prisciliano Silva, Paço Municipal de Salvador, Salvador da Bahia, 1930.
